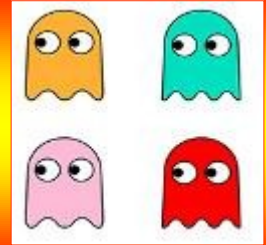

Luckily Mrs Kelly hadn't

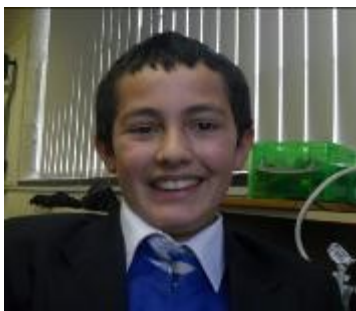
paid for it yet so she didn't have to ask for her money back.

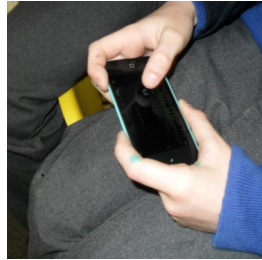
Year five were scared that their belongings may be stolen but they came up with a wide range of expensive gadgets to take in they even said they would take their x-

Year 6 teacher, Miss Scott, said he was entertaining and he taught the children interesting science facts in a funny way.

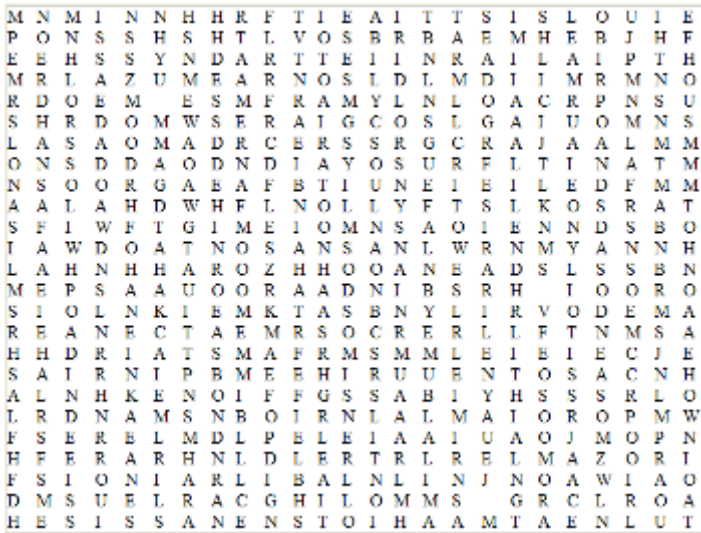
The experiments he did included an aeroplane powered by an elastic band, dinosaur poo and a friction rod.

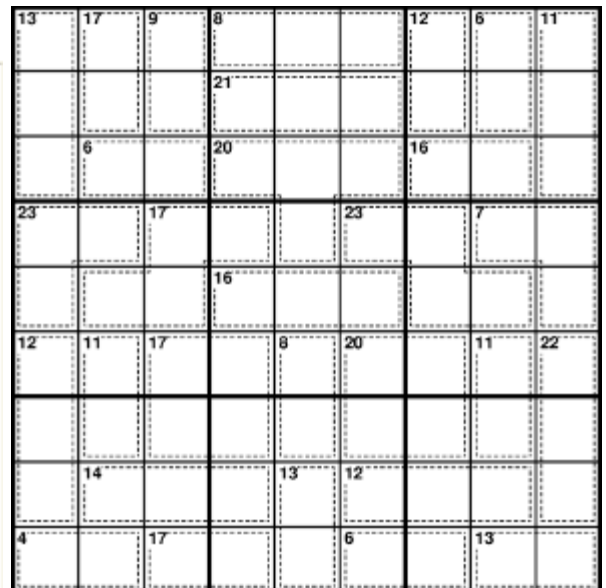
