- Argentina has a population of 40,913,584 as of July 2009. It is a country made up of 23 provinces (states).
- The capital of Argentina is Buenos Aires. It has a population of 16 million people.
- The capital of Buenos Aires is La Plata and that is where the Bush family is working. It has a population of over 1 million people.
- The main religion is Roman Catholicism, but the Pentecostals, Mormons and Jehovah Witnesses are also well-known.

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ARGENTINA TRIP

To go on the Argentina Mission Trip, you must:

- Be saved and baptized.
- Be 16 years of age or older.
- Have your parent's permission, if under 18 years of age.
- Have your pastor's recommendation.
- Know that it is God's will.
- Have enough money.
- Be willing to abide by the rules and regulations that apply to this trip.
- Fill out an application and have it approved.
- Want to attend and see God do a work in your life.
- Get a passport 6-8 weeks prior to departure.

How to get approved to go on the Argentina Mission Trip.

- Make sure you meet the requirements listed above.
- Fill out the *Application Form*.
- Have your pastor complete the *Pastor Recommendation Form*.
- Send all the forms to bush@reachingall.com.

What to do after you are approved:

- Begin the process of raising your money.
- Make sure you have a valid passport.
- Read all of the information in this booklet.

TRAVEL TO ARGENTINA

PASSPORTS AND VISAS

- ☑ Before the trip you should make sure and get your passport. You will need a couple of passport photos, two pieces of identification, and the required fee. It takes about 2 months to get your passport so please start early. Call your local post office to be sure of what you will need to do.
- ☑ You will pay a tourist visa of \$130 when you arrive in the country. Make sure you do not lose any forms that you fill out on the plane. They will have you fill out a form to declare anything valuable. Do not declare anything on this form. For more information www.travel.state.gov/travel/cis_pa_tw/cis/cis_1130.html

DATES

- ☑ To be arranged with your group coordinator.
- ☑ The summer months here are from October – February. The winter months are from May – August. During the winter the average temperature is 52° F and during the summer months 76° F. For more accurate information on the weather, check out www.weather.com.
- ☑ It is best to schedule a trip from 7-10 days.

COST

\$1,830/person [Will vary depending on the trip.]

Plane Tickets	\$1200/person from the Atlanta airport*
Visa cost	\$130/person (paid when arrive to the Buenos Aires Airport)
Transportation	\$100/person
Food	\$100/person
Spending	\$100/person (depending on the individual)
Lodging	\$100/person
Extra costs	\$100 (for any emergency spending, airport tax - \$18, etc)

* The price of tickets greatly varies with the time of the year and may be higher if flying from another area of the United States.



LUGGAGE

- ☑ You will be allowed two 50 lb. suitcases (depending on airline you fly with), a carry-on and a personal item. If possible please be willing to bring down articles for the missionaries or the ministry as there are always needed supplies that could be brought from the States.
- ☑ Your carry-on must be small enough to fit under the seat in front of you or in the overhead bin.
- ☑ Your personal item can be one of the following items: a purse, briefcase, laptop/computer (all laptop/computers must be carried aboard and cannot be checked), camera case, or an item of similar or smaller size.*
- ☑ Your name needs to be on every piece of luggage. All baggage is subject to being searched. You are not allowed to lock any luggage.
- ☑ It would be helpful to tie a brightly colored ribbon on your suitcases to quickly recognize them as they come through the baggage carousel.
- ☑ Do not take anything you do not need. Leave valuables at home. Go through your wallet or purse and purge them of credit cards and items you will not need in Argentina.
- ☑ Pack liquids in a sealable plastic bag before placing them in your suitcase.

PACKING CHECKLIST

Remember to pack the following items:

- Bible and notebook for messages
- Journal or diary and spare pens
- Clothes and shoes for church
- Camera
- Prescription medicines
- Only necessary credit cards
- Toiletries and cosmetics
- Snacks that are durable to pack (i.e. Granola bars, candy bars, etc.)
- Light-weight jacket or sweater
- Good walking shoes

Do not pack the following items in your checked luggage:

- Your passport
- Money or anything valuable
- Needed medications

Remember to place the following items in your carry-on:

- Passport
- Photo ID
- Bible
- Journal/Notebook and Ink pen
- Tickets
- Camera
- Itinerary
- Needed medications
- Change of clothing in case your luggage is lost in transit or arrives later than you do!

Note: The electrical current here is 220v and 50hz. Unless it is dual voltage it will not work. Laptops, digital video cameras, and razors are usually dual voltage. Check to make sure before bringing it down. If it is something absolutely necessary you may use one of our transformers.

DRESS

During the winter months (May-August), La Plata, Argentina can get very cold. You will need to bring winter clothes for these months. The churches do not have heating so please bring warm clothing. During the summer (November-February) it gets very hot (sometimes close to 100 degrees with high humidity). You will want some relatively comfortable shoes for all the walking we will be doing.

You will be visiting the mission field. Please understand that this is much more than a tourist trip although you will have the opportunity to do much of the tourist activities. Since it is a mission's trip and we know that you want to set a very good example for our brethren on the field, we ask that both men and women wear modest clothing.

ARRIVAL

A few instructions for the airport when you land in Buenos Aires, Argentina:

Deplane and follow the crowd around to Immigrations (where you will pay the visa fee). From there you will go to the luggage belt and pick up your suitcases. Then proceed to the Custom's agent. He will look at your passport and declaration and have you proceed (possibly opening your bags). Follow the crowd on out of the customs area into the main airport and one of us will be waiting on you.

HOUSING

Each guest will be staying either in our home or a close hotel. The place you will be staying in will have electricity, hot and cold water, comfortable beds, good security, and a pleasant atmosphere. There may be unexpected inconveniences but please be flexible.

SAFETY

- Do not drink the water from the tap. You will need to drink only the filtered water provided in each home.
- Always be careful to watch your things while on the trip or in town. Airports always have lots of thieves, pickpockets etc. Do not wear excessive amounts of jewelry or something that might call attention to thieves. Do not flash your money around.
- It is not required to have vaccinations before coming to Argentina although you may want to check with your health department.



- ☑ Everyone will be allowed to call home when they arrive to let parents know they made it fine. We have a Vonage phone which will let us call anywhere in the U.S. for no extra charge.

CULTURE DO'S AND DON'TS

1. Do not treat the church or pastors any differently than you would a church in the United States.
3. Do not eat or drink in front of them without offering them something.
4. Do not constantly criticize their country or talk about your country and all that you miss there or how it is better, etc.
6. Develop a taste for their foods. Eat with them. Do not turn your nose up at their food.
7. Do not skip church or stay outside the building during church services, etc. Get involved with the people in the service.
8. Look at things like they do. They aren't strange or new--you are.
9. They will ask you if you like their country. Think about the many positive things and say "yes", even if there are some things you don't like. It would be very offensive to tell them you didn't like their country.
10. Always ask the missionary before giving someone money and never take out your wallet in front of other people.
11. It is Argentine culture to "kiss" (cheek to cheek kiss) as a greeting instead of a handshake. Everyone greets with a kiss (men to men, men to women, and women to women). To refuse to "kiss" them is very offensive to them and they would not understand even if you explained to them.

PREACHING AND TEACHING

We want every God called preacher to have a chance to preach. You must understand that preference will be given to those who are pastors and preachers in the full time ministry. If possible we will have everyone who desires give at least a word of testimony. The missionaries will tell you how much time you have to teach or preach.

HOW TO GIVE YOUR TESTIMONY IN THE SERVICES:

1. Write out your testimony. It will surprise you how easy it is to get sidetracked by all the translating.
2. Keep it brief, maybe about 3 minutes! With translation 3 minutes will turn into 5!
3. Open with a greeting in Spanish. The folks like it when you try to speak their language and show an interest.
4. Tell who you are and a little bit about you, married, work, something about your family, etc.



5. Add a couple of positive statements about the country, the church, and the people!
6. Do not talk about the poverty of the area, the currency as funny money, how sorry you feel for them, etc.
7. Tell what Christ has done for you, how did you get saved, how did you realize your need of a Savior, how has your life changed, how has Christ helped you lately.
8. Give a verse and make sure and give the application.
9. Do not give graphic details about your sin or your past life.
10. Avoid slang and idioms in your testimony. They can be very difficult to translate and may have no meaning in the other language.
11. Do not use very long sentences or very short either. Give a good thought that can be easily remembered by the translator!
12. Avoid stressing your material success or blessings and especially making any comparisons to what the people have in the country you are visiting!
13. Avoid speaking of the sacrifice that you made to get to the field. Remember what it cost you to get to the country may be several months of a working man's income. You may share with them the blessing of being able to come and how good God was to answer your prayers and make it possible to be there!
14. Don't tell jokes, etc. without prior approval to make sure that they translate, etc.
15. Thank the folks again and ask them to pray for you. Be excited about the country and the opportunity to be there.

KEEP A JOURNAL OF YOUR TRIP!

- A Diary of your daily thoughts and events
- A record of your prayer requests
- A record of how you felt on the trip
- Preserve your joy for future memories
- Keep a list of what you are learning and how God is working in your life
- Write down quotes and sayings that you hear that are a blessing to you
- Review your day with God
- Be able to share with your family, friends and church all that God did in your life on the trip

TIPS ON HOW TO KEEP A JOURNAL

- Start before you leave home
- Set aside a quiet time each day for writing
- Answer some questions in your journal entries like the following:

1. What did you learn today that will benefit your spiritual life?

3. What did you learn about serving Him?
4. What did you do today?
5. Who did you meet today?
6. What decision did you make today for your spiritual life and growth?

POSSIBLE SCHEDULE DURING THE ARGENTINA TRIP

- Ⓢ Orientation and Classes or discussions
- Ⓢ Devotional time each day
- Ⓢ Tour Downtown Buenos Aires, including Caminito, Florida Street, the Obelisk, the Jewish and Chinese neighborhoods
- Ⓢ Shopping
- Ⓢ Church services in different national churches where you can participate in testimony and special music
- Ⓢ Tour one of the biggest Gothic-style Catholic churches in the south America
- Ⓢ Soul winning visitation and passing out gospel tracts
- Ⓢ Visit the cemetery
- Ⓢ See certain sights and pray over the city
- Ⓢ Trip to nearby cities such as Quilmes, Avellaneda, etc
