## Livestock

Health South East offers farmers in the region the opportunity to benefit from high quality training and knowledge transfer activities, funded by DEFRA through RDPE.

These activities will include meetings, discussion groups, on-line training and one-to-one veterinary advice. Training is being delivered by a number of partners, including EBLEX, BPEX, DairyCo, NADIS, NFU, ADAS, Kingshay and local veterinary practices.

## Individual Veterinary Advice

Farmers and livestock keepers in the South East of England can receive individual training from veterinary surgeons, which will be tailored to meet the requirements of the farm and its livestock. The training can cover any aspect of the recognition, identification, recording and prevention of diseases affecting livestock on each individual farm.

The Individual Veterinary Advice offered through Livestock Health South East means farmers can now access the most up-to-date information and training, tailored to meet their exact individual requirements.

## Online Training
