### ACADEMIC REQUIRMENTS

1. Athletes are required to turn in their report card from the 4th quarter of the previous year of school. This is to include ALL subjects.
2. Each athlete must have a grade average of 70% or above, with no F's for eligibility. Athletes with F's may still participate with the following restrictions:
  - a. 1 F athlete must sit out for the first game
  - b. 2 F's athlete must sit out for the first and second game
  - c. 3 F's athlete must sit out for the first, second and third games.
  - d. Any more than three F's, athlete will be ineligible.
  - e. Pre-season scrimmages will NOT count as a game to sit out for.
3. Athletes with IEP Plans, special education or any other type of educational assistance, must abide by the above guidelines as well.
4. Report cards (with grades already calculated into a %) and roster listings, for each team must be turned in on or before the August Mid-State Conference meeting. New students moving in would be exempt from August deadline. Rosters are to include: team name, jersey numbers, name, age, weight, date of birth and grade level of each player.
5. Academic waivers can be granted, with appeal made in person to the Mid-State Board.
6. Each community is responsible for determining eligibility for their players.
7. Mid-State Academic Committee will be responsible for determining 1st, 2nd and 3rd place for the conference on both the Pee Wee and Junior Pee Wee Levels.
8. Cheerleaders will be figured in with the football teams. (Junior Pee Wee Cheer Squads with Junior Pee Football team, Pee Wee Cheer Squads with Pee Wee Football Teams).
9. Summer school can NOT be used as a substitute for poor grades.
10. Any community not meeting the report card deadline will be ineligible for the football play-offs and cheerleading competition at the conclusion of the season.
